Christiana Sideri, Director, Commission for the Protection of Competition, Republic of Cyprus

Christiana Sideri is an economist. She holds a B.Sc. (Econ) Degree from The London School of Economics and Political Science and a M.Phil Degree in Econometrics from the University of Cambridge. She has been with the Commission since 2003. She was appointed as the Director of the Service of the Commission for the Protection of Competition (the investigative body of the Commission) in October 2010. Prior to that, she held the position of the Senior Officer from July 2006 till September 2010 and that of Economic Consultant from March 2003 till June 2006. Before joining the Commission she worked in the financial services sector and in the Ministry of Finance.

George Komodromos, Director, Department of Electronic Communications

George Komodromos has a Degree in Electrical Engineering (University of Patras), MSc in Electronics (University of London), and MBA (University of Cyprus). Today he is the Director in the Department of Electronic Communications of the Ministry of Transport, Communications and Works and he is mainly working on issues of Formulating and monitoring the implementation of the national Digital Strategy, on Regulating the use of radio spectrum and protecting the health of citizens, and on Formulating and monitoring the implementation of the national Space Strategy

George Michaelides, Commissioner of Electronic Communications and Postal Regulation

George has more than 20 years of experience in IT. He holds a B.Eng in Computer Engineering and an MSc in Communication Systems. For the last 14 years he has been working for international organizations holding various senior Regional Service Delivery and Service Management roles, ensuring impeccable service through the implementation/adoption of IT Best Practices. Currently is leading the Cyprus national regulatory authority (OCECPR) for Electronic Communications and Postal Services which is also the coordinating body for the implementation of Cyprus Cybersecurity Strategy. He is also the Chairman of the advisory board for the project of Cyber Crime Center of Excellence (3CE). As part of his Regulatory duties he is a Board member of the Body of European Regulators for Electronic Communications (BEREC), the European Mediterranean Regulators Group (EMERG) and the European Regulators Group for Postal Services (ERGP). Neophytos Papadopoulos has been the director of the Office of the Commissioner of Electronic Communications and Postal Regulation since its establishment in 2002.
